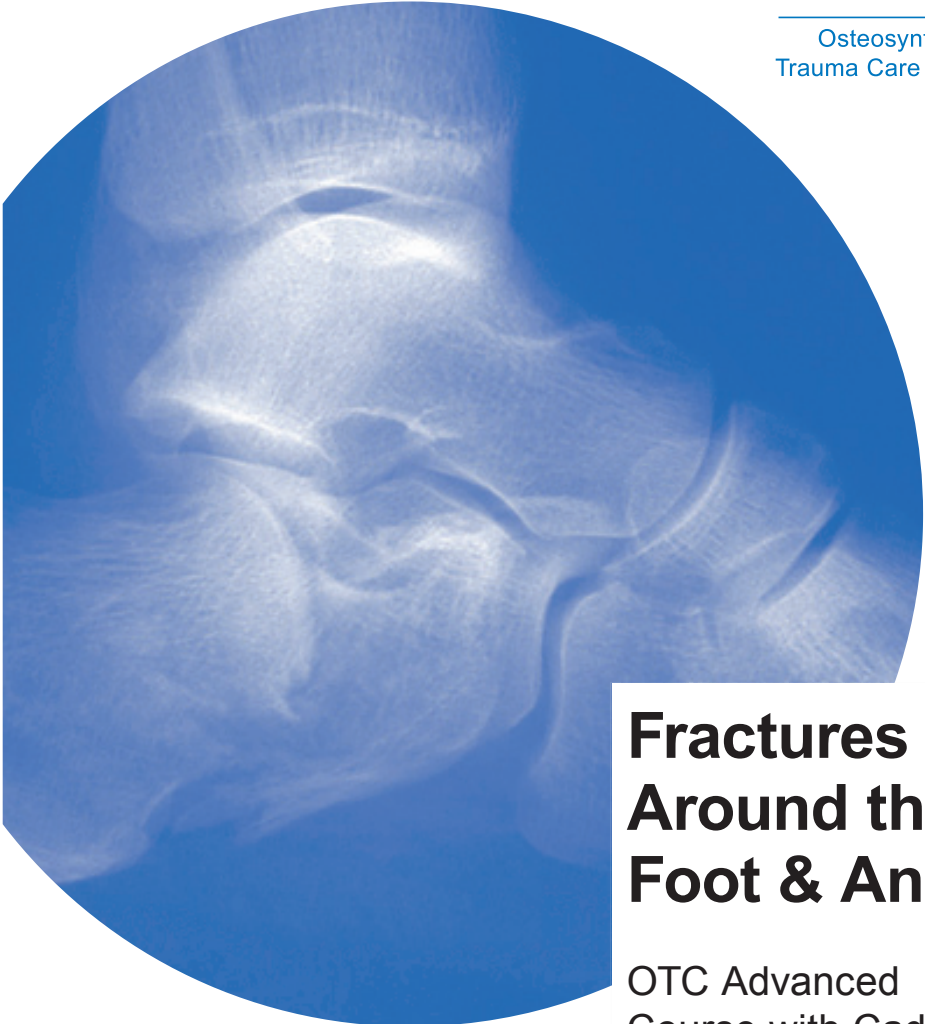

## COURSE DESCRIPTION

The course will focus on fractures of the foot and ankle, including pilon and ankle fractures, calcaneum and talus fractures, and Lisfranc fracture-dislocations. Many aspects will be treated, including a step-by-step description of the surgical approaches and osteosynthesis. Focusing on technical tricks and pitfalls, the course also covers the different options for fracture management in routine and complex foot and ankle injuries. The course will also stress the management of complex fractures in diabetic patients, compartmental syndrome, soft tissue injuries and the state-of-the art in arthroscopic application in foot and ankle.

In addition to lectures, hands-on cadaver workshops allow participants ample opportunities to improve their skills on approaches and fracture fixation. In small discussion groups participants can present and discuss their most difficult cases with experienced international faculty members.

## TARGET AUDIENCE

This course is aimed at the more experienced surgeon (senior trainee, fellow or consultant), interested in the management of foot and ankle fractures.
